Fast Facts | FY 2016-17



This past fiscal year has once again been a memorable one for the Community Foundation, and we thank you for your tremendous support and your role in the growth of the Community Foundation's assets, impact, and influence.

This report and our message goes beyond the 2016-17 fiscal year to include information on the Community Foundation's yearlong celebration of our 50th anniversary and our "Be the Spark" grantmaking campaign that was a huge success! We made "Spark Grants" totaling \$300,000 to 29 organizations and we hosted important community events to bring awareness to the Spark Issues and the work of the Community Foundation.

In addition, several important things have happened which we believe will strengthen our already impressive growth in grantmaking. First, the Board of Governors approved the creation of our Community Investments Committee. By focusing the efforts of our board on making investments of resources we believe we are better reflecting the Foundation's strong desire to make impactful grants to improve the quality of life in the Lehigh Valley. Second, we were very proud to announce the establishment of the position of Director of Community Investments at the Community Foundation and in November, 2017, we welcomed Megan Briggs as our first director.

As the community prepared for tax reform, members of the staff of the Community Foundation were able to provide guidance and leadership. President and CEO Bernie Story was guoted in the Washington Post explaining the profession's concern about possible threats to charitable deductions and Director of Donor Services Erika Petrozelli authored several thought pieces on maximizing charitable giving which appeared in the media.

The Delphine Quinn Perpetual Fund

Delphine Quinn was born and raised in Easton, Pa. She graduated from the Allentown General Nursing School in the 1940s. She was a compassionate nurse who traveled the country to help patients in the 1950s, a time when travel was not easy, and she even traveled to Indian reservations in Oregon, Arkansas and Minnesota to work as a registered nurse.

Delphine loved the profession, and she wanted her legacy to support others in this field for which she so deeply cared. The Delphine Quinn Perpetual Fund was established with a bequest from Delphine, who passed away on May 8, 2015.

In conjunction with the BB&T/National Penn merger in 2016, \$5 million was donated to two local foundations with the Lehigh Valley Community Foundation receiving \$2.5 million to establish the BB&T Economic Growth Fund of the Lehigh Valley. The fund awards grants to initiatives that will improve the standard of living and economic health of the Lehigh Valley through business attraction and incubation, industrial growth and creation of sustainable and thriving wage jobs.

During FY17, \$1.5 million in grants were made to several Lehigh Valley organizations from the BB&T Economic Growth Fund at the Lehigh Valley Community Foundation. 



The Community Foundation celebrated Mr. Hottle's commitment to the evolving needs of the Lehigh Valley by presenting him with the Vision in Philanthropy Award in 2005. In 2013, Mr. Hottle established the Lötter Family Fund in honor of his daughter and son-in-law, Linda & Etienne Lötter.

Mr. Hottle doesn't think of charitable giving in terms of legacy. Providing consistent support to local charities is what is important to him.

The Joan A. Kraft & R. Wayne Kraft Memorial Fund was established in 2016 by former LVCF Board of Governors' member, Ellen M. Kraft, Esq., in loving memory of her parents. The donor-advised fund provides grants to charitable organizations in the region, as a means of memorializing the philanthropic nature of the late R. Wayne and Joan Kraft.

R. Wayne Kraft, Jr., was a 1948 graduate of Lehigh University, who served in the US Army Corps of Engineers during WWII. Dr. Kraft returned to Lehigh in 1962 as a Professor of Metallurgy and Materials Science He was a specialist in the fields of physical metallurgy, X-Ray diffraction. solidification and crystallography. He held multiple patents, wrote more than 50 technical papers and received multiple professional awards, including the prestigious Bradley Stoughton Award.

Joan Auchter Kraft was a 1946 graduate of Cornell University, receiving a degree in the field of Home Economics. She taught at the Connecticut College for Women. Joan became the first woman to serve as a volunteer associate chaplain at St. Luke's Hospital, having obtained a degree in pastoral care. Learn more about the fund...

Rolland Adams is one of the founders of the Lehigh Valley Community Foundation. Born in rural Huntingdon, Pennsylvania, Rolland Adams attended Dickinson College before becoming a bank examiner. He purchased the Bethlehem

Globe Times in 1929 at the worst of the Great Depression and turned it around. In addition to being named Publisher and Owner of the Bethlehem Globe Times, he was the President of the Bethlehem City News Company and the A.B.E. Broadcasting Company. Adams also purchased the Atlantic City Press. In 1963, he purchased 90% holding of both the Pittsburgh and Bethlehem Coca-Cola bottling factories.

Adams was well-known in the community and was instrumental in the construction of the Bethlehem Public Library. After his death, Adams became the first million-dollar donor in the Foundation's history with his \$1,000,000 unrestricted bequest which, at the time, represented a five-fold increase in the assets of the Foundation.





Make the First Five Count (MTFFC) uses the Ages & Stages Questionnaire (ASQ), a comprehensive standardized tool that assesses five developmental areas. Parents can determine if their child has, or is at risk for, developmental delay. The ASQ is on the Easterseals Eastern Pennsylvania (ESEP) website and used during on-site screenings in the Lehigh Valley.

ESEP has a designated developmental specialist who follows up with each parent, offering resources, appropriate referral information, suggestions on activities to enhance existing skills and linking them to the county Early Intervention referral system. 


